Post –Secondary Options and Assessments:

First Question.....What are my options?

- 1.) UC/CSU – University Admission (attachment)
- 2.) Junior College Admission
- 3.) Trade or “vocational” school
- 4.) Military (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine, Coast Guard)
- 5.) Employment

Second Question....What assessment is necessary for each?

- 1.) University = SAT or ACT
- 2.) High School Diploma (sometimes schools may require an orientation)
- 3.) Trade Schools vary requirements so it is always recommended they you contact their admissions office directly.
- 4.) Military requires taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) as well as a physical fitness component.
- 5.) Employers are seeking drug-free applicants that are reliable, trustworthy and can pass a background check.

 an approved senior year-long math course:
 All courses with a prerequisite of Algebra II or Integrated Math III, including: Trigonometry, Math Analysis, Pre-Calculus, or Calculus, AP Calculus AB or BC, AP Physics or AP Statistics

Must pass senior year-long course with a grade of "C-" or better in order to be exempt from participating in the CSU Early Start Program

 ACT: 18 or below, New SAT: 500 or below, Old SAT: 450 or below
 Math:
 ACT: 19 or below, New SAT: 510 or below, Old SAT: 480 or below

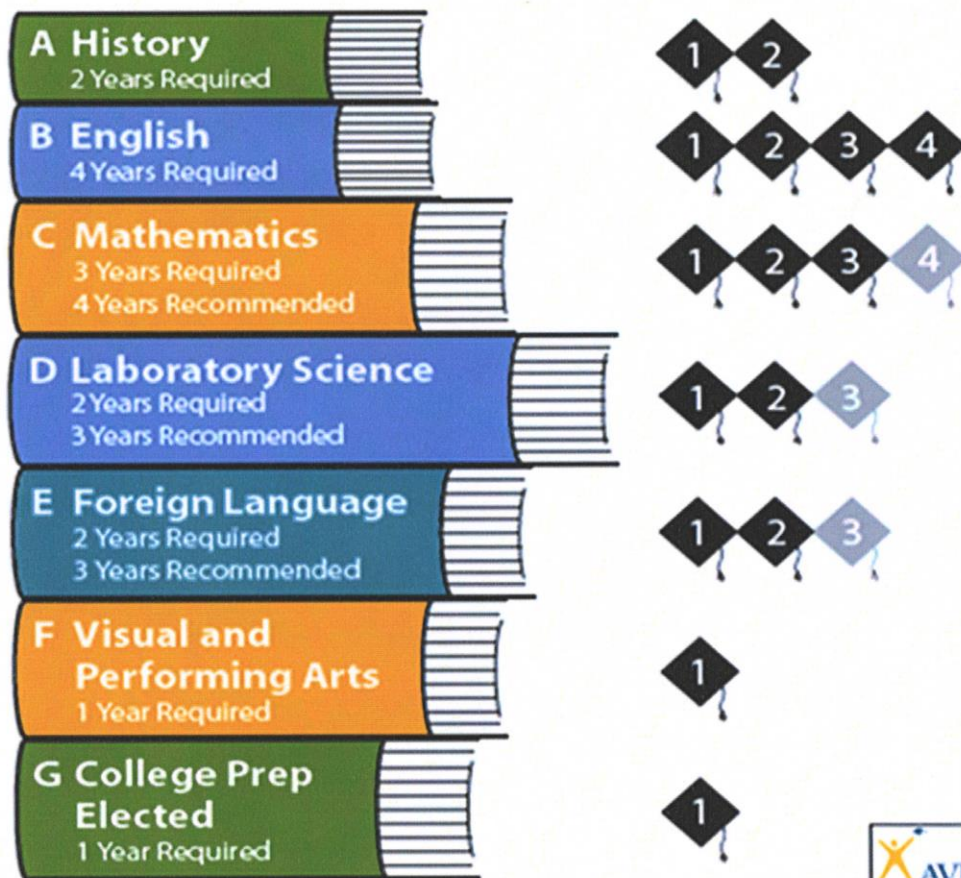
