#### College and Career Ready Defined



It is the goal at West Valley High School to have every graduate "College and Career Ready". We believe that every student needs the same academic preparation to be college and career ready. Our students need to fully realize this goal in order to compete for high wage employment in the 21<sup>st</sup> global economy. We define "College and Career Readiness" as students who acquire the following three skills before graduation:

<u>Academic Skills</u> – Every student will complete a rigorous course of study in one of two ways: A-G completion or A-D completion plus a minimum of 2 years in a career pathway. It is important to note that the A-D course work is the same for college and career.

<u>Technical Skills</u> – Every student will acquire technical skills in an elective course of study that is related to individual career goals. Students may choose from our many Career and Technical Education Pathways to acquire skills necessary to compete for high wage employment.

**Employability Skills** - These are the skills that are critical to workplace success in the 21<sup>st</sup> century economy. These skills include critical thinking, adaptability, problem-solving, oral and written communications, collaboration and teamwork, creativity, responsibility, professionalism, ethics, and technology use.

Regardless of each individual student pathway, it takes all three of these broad skill sets for students to be ready for a career. At West Valley High school, we are focusing on providing all students a strong foundation across all three areas so they are prepared for whatever their lives may bring.


