CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Schaefer moved, seconded by Mr. Gibson to approve the agenda for the Regular Meeting of the AUHSD Board of Trustees for March 15, 2022. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue

Student Representatives, David Silva (Alt Ed), Seth Forehand (AUHS), Ashton Oilar (ANTHS), and Austin Flood (WVECHS) reported on school activities, athletics, and academics.

Mr. Brandt Shriner spoke about increasing the science requirement for graduation. This would be a 30 credit/3 year requirement. It will start with the freshman class of 2023. He will bring it to the board for approval next month.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

- 6.1 No items were removed from the Consent Agenda
- 6.2 Mr. Hopper discussed the possibility of replacing School Resource Officer's from the Sheriff's Department with Juvenile Prevention Officers from the Shasta County Probation Department. One of the benefits would be that an officer would be at the site at all times. The Juvenile Prevention Officers also have other resources available to students. Mr. Schaefer shared his concern with the training of a probation officer versus a police officer but was in favor of the replacement.

HUMAN RESOURCES

- 6.3 Mr. Brown moved, seconded by Mr. Schaefer to approve the appointment of Mark Beebe to the position of Principal at Anderson Union High School effective July 1, 2022. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue

INSTRUCTIONAL

- 6.4 Mr. Schaefer moved, seconded by Mr. Gibson to approve the School Plans for Student Achievement for Anderson Union High School, West Valley Early College High School, Anderson New Technology High School and North Valley High School for 2021-22. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue
- 6.5 Mr. Gibson moved, seconded by Mr. Schaefer to adopt the Adult Education Resolution to reduce the diploma requirements by 20 elective credits resulting in a 160-credit diploma. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue
- 6.6 After Mr. Hopper informed the Board of Trustees that the amount of the grant had increased, Mr. Gibson moved, seconded by Mrs. Fuller to approve the A-G Completion Improvement Grant Plan Allocation for Anderson Union High School District and Anderson New Technology High School. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue

BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL

- 6.7 Mr. Schaefer moved, seconded by Mr. Gibson to approve the Second Interim Reports: The Resolution for Second Interim Budget Adjustment; Certify the District's ability to meet its financial obligations. The motion carried: Ayes – Fuller, Schaefer, Gibson, Brown; Absent – Trotter-Hogue

REPORTS AND COMMENTS

Brian Parker, Principal of AUHS and Director of Human Resources proposed reimbursing the athletic coaches the fees they must pay to coach. The fees can add up to \$220. When the coach finishes the season in good standing, they would be paid their stipend and then be reimbursed for the requirements needed to coach. He will bring it to

the board for approval next month. Mr. Parker also reported on school activities, athletics, and academics at his site.

Lupe Cordova, Principal of Alternative Education reported on school activities, athletics, and academics.

Josh Mason, Principal of West Valley Early College High School reported on school activities, athletics, and academics.

Terry Bennett, Principal of Anderson New Technology High School reported on school activities, athletics, and academics.

Brandt Shriner, Director of Educational Services reported on the increase he is seeing in IEP's. Educational Services are going well.

Donell Evans, CBO, thanked Jennifer Parks and Elke Proscher for all they do in the business department.

Victor Hopper, Superintendent gave an update on enrollment. Mr. Hopper gave recognition to Jared Stout, Lead Custodian for Anderson Union High School. Because of his quick response, Jared diffused a potential harmful situation in a classroom.

Butch Schaefer, Board Clerk stated he is very proud of our dedicated staff and thanked everyone. He welcomed Mr. Beebe to Anderson Union High School.

Patricia Fuller, Board President stated that she is proud of how our staff and administrators focus on the students. She would also like to recognize the three students who helped at the scene of the daycare accident. She asked that those students be recognized at the next board meeting.
